Due to Montgomery City being centrally located in our Task Force coverage area, the drop box was chosen to be placed there. The permanent drug drop box is intended for community collaboration with law enforcement and provides a permanent and continuous availability to keep unneeded and expired medications out of the hands of Missouri's youth and citizens. During this reporting period, members of MoWIN assisted with (3) separate Drug Take Backs. The first take back program was sponsored by Jackson County, Missouri COMBAT. It served as safe means to dispose of unwanted narcotics and facilitates a positive interaction between law enforcement and the citizens they serve. This take back was conducted on 04-29-2016, at 113th and Ruskin Way, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. Approximately 20 pounds of drugs were recovered and properly disposed of as a result of the event. The second was the National Drug Take Back on 04-30-2016. The Sgt. and Det. attend weekly meeting with the Clay County, Missouri Drug Court and assist with screening possible Drug Court candidates and serve as a resource of information and support for those currently in the program.</p> <p>Det. M.N. is also actively involved as a mentor within the Clay County, Missouri Veterans Court. The Veterans Court is a program that is adopted by Clay County, Missouri and is only available to veterans who are accused or charged with non-violent offences relating to drug, alcohol and simple assault. The program is designed to assist veterans with any effects/issues they may be suffering from which could be affecting their personal lives, leading to the offense committed. Det. M.N. participates in weekly meeting and is available 24/7 to lend support or be an outlet for the veterans who may find themselves in crisis while in the program. He has had many of the participants call him and discuss issues of harming themselves or relapsing on drugs and has been able to be a direct liaison to the veteran and prevent them from taking negative steps which could have huge impacts on their ability to complete the program successfully. The veterans program is under the 7th Circuit Court, Division 1 of Clay County, Missouri. The court sessions are held at 2:00 pm on Fridays. Det. M.N. assist the veterans in every way ethical possible to ensure a successful outcome from the program. The program is five phases, with some being required to complete live in drug and alcohol treatment programs which may last 30 to 90 days. Upon successful completion of the program, the veteran's charges could be expunged. Det. M.N. reported four veterans successfully completed the Veterans Court program and had a formal graduation on April, 29th, 2016. All four are currently successful in their personal lives.</p>
LAFAYETTE CO NARC	<p>Yes The drug task force implemented and coordinated a school presentation, which included the drug court 'STOP' program clients speaking to junior high and high school students. These drug court 'STOP' program clients participated in a program at the Higginsville High School this quarter. We also have less members of the task force to fight this problem. As drug use is becoming more excepted within our community; prosecution has been very up and down as to charging and sentencing. This makes the problem compounded as we have cheaper drugs, less investigators to fight it and little support from the local prosecutors.
CNET	CNET is currently working with numerous state and federal agencies on a OCDEF case, which has numerous ties to our area.
COMET	COMET has eight officers serving ten counties and has started to initiate long term investigations to make a greater impact on our service area. A drug presentation was given to 25 members as block training to the Greene County Sheriff's Department.
EAST CENTRAL DTF	Our Task Force has continued to provide the services our member agencies have grown to appreciate and expect from our Task Force. Our Task Force continues to conduct overt narcotic investigations in our six county coverage area. Our Task Force continues to assist with several Federal investigations, providing information and with active enforcement. In addition, our Task Force Officers assisted the Mexico Public Safety Department and the Audrain County Sheriff's Department with an enforcement saturation in the Mexico, Missouri, area. This operation led to the arrest of numerous individuals, who were wanted on outstanding warrants in the city limits of Mexico and the Audrain County area. During those arrest, it resulted in the numerous seizure of various narcotics, which were removed from the Mexico and Audrain County community. The Task Force has also conducted drug educational and drug preventative presentations to, business groups, civic organizations, law enforcement agencies and for schools in the communities of our coverage area. The topics of those presentations included drug identification and awareness, prescription medication abuse and methamphetamine abuse.
FRANKLIN CO NARC	We have seen a slight decrease in the number of heroin overdose deaths over the quarter. We had three deaths and four non-fatal overdoses in the month of April. During the months of May and June we had three deaths and 3 non-fatal. We have made a few heroin cases in the St. Louis City area-our source city for heroin. It is not known if this had an effect. We are working closely with DEA St Louis in dealing with the heroin epidemic and are working joint investigations in the St. Louis Area.

JACKSON CO MJDTF

With information developed from a previous investigation Detectives with the JCDF identified a person who was reported to be a multiple pound methamphetamine dealer in Jackson County and the Kansas City metropolitan area. The suspect was reportedly armed and obtaining approximately 20 pounds of methamphetamine a week from a Hispanic male only identified as Moe. In the following weeks Detectives compiled evidence gathered from numerous electronic means including electronic GPS tracking of target vehicles, installation and use of a pen register and GPS locations of cellular telephones (pings), remote electronic surveillance of target residences and countless hours of 24 hour a day electronic and physical surveillance (ground and air) of both suspects. Four residences were identified as locations where drugs, illegal weapons were either stored or sold and probable cause was developed for the issuance of search warrants for three residences located in Kansas City, Missouri and one located in Independence, Missouri. On June 6 a plan for the apprehension of multiple individuals including the both suspects previously identified with the simultaneous execution of search warrants on the four identified locations was implemented. As the tactical team executed the warrant on the residence where Moe was located they received gun fire from inside the residence. A perimeter was set and an operation 100 involving an armed barricaded suspect was implemented. An 8 hour standoff followed with dozens of rounds being fired at Police by Moe from inside the residence. Moe was ultimately shot and died as a result of his injuries after exchanging gun fire with Officers. At the same time Tactical Units from DEA, the Independence Police and Kansas City Police executed the search warrants on the residences for which warrants had been obtained without incident. Multiple suspects were taken into custody. Evidence recovered included: Approximately 11.5 pounds of methamphetamine 53,000.00 cash, U.S. currency 27 firearms One suspect was charged in Federal Court with other charges pending on multiple defendants.

JASPER CO DTF

The Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team had a great 2nd Quarter for 2016. ODET Detectives seized 2362 grams of Meth this quarter and 9,000 grams of High Grade Marijuana. ODET Detectives also seized 4 guns this quarter and initiated 75 investigations and served 20 Search Warrants. On 04/04/2016 ODET Detectives spent 3 hrs working with Carthage Teachers on Drug Recognition. This class was a huge success and had over 50 Teachers in the Class and has already been requested for next year. On 04/21/16 ODET Detectives served a search warrant at 1355 West 5 in Webb City and made 4 arrests after subject fled on foot from the residence. Detectives seized an UZI from the front couch that was in the possession of Ashton Bailey a convicted felon. Detectives also located and seized 45 Xanax. On 04/27/16 ODET Detectives served a Search Warrant in Duneweg Mo were Detectives seized a Meth Lab and made 3 arrests. On 05/10/2016 ODET Detectives served a Search Warrant at 814 Water in Carthage. The warrant led to the arrest of Kristy Britt. Britt confessed to selling approximately a 14 lb of ICE a week.

On the same day ODET Detectives located and arrested Arla Hagan who admitted to selling close to 100 lbs of Meth in the past year. Both Britt and Hagan are on the list to be indicted this month. On 05/10/2016 ODET Detectives also began work on a federal wire tap case. On 05/13/2016 ODET Detectives took part in Exploration Day where we talked to over 150 students at Carl Junction Schools. On 05/24/2015 ODET Detectives served a Search Warrant at 717 Walker in Webb City which led to the arrest of 5 subjects for possession of a controlled substance. On 06/13/2016 ODET Detectives went to Lamar Mo. And work with PD Officers and conducted 2 traffic stops and made two buys and made 1 arrest for DUI. On 06/15/2016 ODET Detectives took part in a saturation detail in Monett Mo. That resulted in 10 Knock and Talks and several traffic stops. On 06/16/2016 ODET Detectives served a Search Warrant at 1032 James in Carthage that led to the arrest of Casey Simpson who was in possession of 12 ounce of ICE. That arrest then furthered our investigation that led to the eventual arrest of Sergio Ortiz who ODET Detectives arrested in a Joplin Hotel and was in possession of 3 lbs of ICE, \$10,000 USC, handgun and Cocaine. On 06/29/2016 ODET Detectives served 1 Search Warrant in Lamar and 2 Search Warrants in Carthage. ODET Detectives continue to see a rise in ICE coming to this area but continue to work large scale investigations which have led to several indictments with more pending. Several DTO's have been identified and we have continued with aggressive enforcement actions against them.

MoWIN continued to see an increase of in cocaine just as in the 3rd quarter. Detectives recovered 15 kilograms of cocaine from a courier on 05-31-2016. Federal charges were obtained. MoWIN detectives instructed a class about interdiction techniques to include indicators of trafficking, and methods of concealment to a class of police cadets at the Kansas City, Missouri Police Academy on April 7th. The class is designed to help the front line officers recognize drug couriers, concealment methods and how to get in touch with MoWIN Interdiction detectives in the event they believe they have located interdiction activities. MoWIN assisted Marceline, MO. police department with a controlled delivery of marijuana during this quarter. MoWIN detectives located a suspicious parcel going to Marceline. Contact was made with Marceline police and a controlled delivery was organized. Investigators a residence check was conducted in the city of Marceline which led to the identification of an active drug house investigators recovered over one pound of hydro marijuana and signs of an active drug house in Marceline. MoWIN detectives assisted in the interview of the suspect and also gave Marceline Police Department the contact information to the NITRO DTF. MoWIN detectives worked with members of three different Johnson County, Missouri law enforcement agencies on techniques of transportation and parcels interdiction. The agencies were Warrensburg and Holden Police Departments and Johnson County Sheriff's Department. Interdiction efforts led to the recovery of (2) marijuana grow operations, recovered firearms and a large quantity of interdicted marijuana. MoWIN detectives have begun putting a new

emphasis on commercial motor vehicle interdiction. We have been working in conjunction with KCMO PD CMVI unit, MSHP, DEA, and DEA TFO's from across the KC metropolitan area to conduct organized Inspection/interdiction activities of commercial vehicles. We have set a goal of two days a month to contribute to such activities. They were conducted on 05-24-2016 and 05-31-2016 which resulted in 47 drivers being contacted and 25 consent searches of commercial vehicles. Two additional dates were conducted on 06-21-2016 and 06-22-2016 involving various agencies 33 drivers were contacted and 18 consent to searches were conducted. Investigative efforts led to the seizure \$19,340.00 from an interdicted vehicle. Three members of KCPD assigned to MoWIN attended the national DHE Conference in San Antonio, Texas April 26th to April 29th. The conference covered interdiction techniques and trends (Capt. DG, Sgt. RG, and Sgt. KE). Seven members of MoWIN attended the Smugglers Inc. training held in Lenexa, Kansas May 10th to May 13th. The training covered 32 hours of interdiction/smuggling techniques, trends and issues (Det. BR, Det. MM, Det. JB, Det. JP, Det. Det. MM, and Det. MC). Eight members of MoWIN attended the 2016 INIA Drug/Terrorism Interdiction Training Conference from June 5th to June 9th. The conference was internationally based and covered a wide variety of lectures/classes pertaining to interdiction trends, techniques and issues surrounding them (Lt. JT, Sgt. KE, Det. EP, Det. RH, Det. AW, Det. JB, Det. JH, Det. CS, and Det. AI). Six members of MoWIN were re-certified in Clandestine Laboratory on June 27th (Sgt. KE, Det. ER, Det. MM, Det. JH, Det. MM, and Det. JP). Clay County Sheriff's Office submitted the following information about training during the 4th quarter for their members assigned to MoWIN. April 3rd to 6th Sgt. PC attended the Missouri Drug Court Conference at Tan-Tara, in Lake Ozark, Missouri. May 18th to 20th Sgt. PC, Det. GB, Det. JB, Det. AI, Det. MN attended the Operation Pipeline (Highway Interdiction) training at Camp Dodge, Iowa. May 23rd to 25th Det. JB and Det. MN attended a Basic Methamphetamine training program at Camp Dodge, Iowa. Platte County Sheriff's Office submitted the following information about notable events during the 4th quarter for their members assigned to MoWIN. Det. BM was selected for appointment to the MoWIN, Non-Interdiction side of the task force. He will fill a vacancy that occurred after Det. BP left his assignment at MoWIN. Platte County has selected a new supervisor to fill the current vacancy at the MoWIN task force. Det. MS was promoted to Sgt. from within the task force and will now assume the respective roles of the previous vacant position. Sgt. MS began his new role on 07-01-2016. The promotion MS to sergeant created another vacancy for the position of detective at MoWIN. Det. BH was selected to fill that vacancy. Members of Interdiction side of MoWIN have been assisting a sister drug unit in the assembly and submission of field possession cases over the past month or so. Members have been assigned and filed or inactivated the following state cases for drug violations during the month of June, 2016. The Number of Cases Assigned 70. The Number of

The task force continues to strive and maintain a balance of local drug investigations, highway interdiction investigations and community involvement as outlined in our goals and objectives. It was somewhat difficult this last quarter because of the new 2016/17 grant application and budget revisions. The task force also had an agent out the entire last quarter on medical leave, which made it that much more difficult. We are currently caught up on most of the paper work involved and are looking forward to the new grant year.

LANEG

LANEG and its task force K9 assisted the Maries County Sheriff and the county's school system by employing the task force K9 to conduct a narcotics sweep of the lockers in the high school. This proactive approach by the sheriff, school system and LANEG to prevent drugs from impacting the schools and students helps to build relations and foster trust between the community, school system and law enforcement. The assignment of a LANEG TFO to the Osage County Drug Coalition Panel allows for the task force to provide input and experience from law enforcement point of view. The Panel and the LANEG task force understand the impact of drug usage is not a problem that can be solved solely through arrest, other avenues of intervention and rehabilitation need to be developed. The task force continues to work with the Missouri State Probation and Parole in three counties within the task force area. This joint work approach has built up lines of communication between the agencies and has allowed for a better collection of intelligence, identification and intervention of illegal drug use in the task force area. These investigations target subjects at risk for substance abuse and/or sales who are currently assigned and supervised by the probation and parole within the task force area. This combined effort allows the agencies to identify subjects who may be better served by increased drug intervention programs or subjects who may need to be prosecuted in local courts. LANEG continues to focus its major efforts on combating the illegal drug trade in the five county task force area. The task force has scheduled and will continue to provide training to local agencies, schools and community groups about local drug trends and the impact of drugs on the community. Marijuana, illegal sales of prescription medication, and heroin sales remain present in certain areas of the task force but have not appeared to increase. Three abandoned meth laboratories were seized during this quarterly reporting period. The continued low number of meth laboratories may be due to the availability of crystal methamphetamine and the proactive enforcement of assigned and trained task force officers in their assigned area of responsibility. Hydroponic marijuana and methamphetamine `ice` sales and availability have appeared to increase in the task force area. LANEG officers continue to see a decrease in the sale of synthetic marijuana and bath salts by local distributors in the task force area. Confidential sources have informed our officers, individuals purchasing synthetic drugs are having to travel outside of the LANEG

This decrease may be a direct result from aggressive investigations and local distributors being informed of the illegal nature and laws concerning the sales of synthetic drugs. LANEG is currently participating in follow up investigations and several ongoing federal and state investigations involving the distribution of crystal methamphetamine, hydroponic marijuana and synthetic drugs. LANEG officers have initiated and are currently involved in undercover investigations focusing on known drug distributors in the task force area. LANEG is currently working with and de-conflicting drug investigations with other task forces in the Troop F, D and I areas.
MID-MO MJDTF	Three guns seized during quarter. One arrest felon with firearm, two warrant arrest and one child endangerment arrest. One butane honey oil lab seized.
MINERAL AREA DTF	During the reporting period officers with the Mineral Area Drug Task Force assisted with a murder for hire investigation. As a result of the investigation three arrest were made.
MUSTANG	The MUSTANG Drug Task Force applied for 22 and executed 20 search warrants in Cole County, Callaway County, Cooper County and Boone County. Search warrants resulted in the seizure of \$30,000.00 in US currency, 3 vehicles, and 13 firearms. The task force was able to capture, Vernon Phelps, one of Missouri's top 10 most wanted, with the cooperation of Maries County and he had 45 grams of meth.
NEMO TF	The Task Force assisted a local law enforcement agency with a case involving identity theft and stealing. This resulted in the arrest of 4 individuals. The Task Force recently filled the open position of Special Agent that had been vacant for several months. This officer is in the process of fulfilling training requirements.
NITRO	NITRO was involved in four search warrants, two in Jackson County, one in Kansas City Kansas and one in Trenton, Missouri. The search warrant in Trenton Missouri resulted in the seizure of 47 firearms, twenty-two hits of LSD, 25 grams of meth and 75 grams of marijuana. NITRO assisted Grundy County with a roundup of twelve defendants charged with distribution of controlled substances. A long term case came to an end with the federal indictment of seven individuals for the distribution of controlled substances and firearm violations. NITRO received information and conducted surveillance on a residence in Daviess County and arrested two individuals while they were breaking into the residence. During the last part of June 2016 several interviews were conducted which appears to be leading towards a long term investigation of a large conspiracy involving the trafficking of methamphetamine into our area of north Missouri from Kansas City, Missouri. During an interview, the last part of June, NITRO received information about an individual wanting to hire someone to commit a murder. NITRO has set up a meeting with the individual and will try to make a case. The case will not be resolved during this grant cycle.

NOMO DTF

NOMO held a bi-monthly Board of Directors meeting attended by (16) sixteen of their 22 member agencies. A NOMO Confidential Informant provided information that led to Postal Inspector making an arrest in Kansas City of an individual supplying illegal narcotics in the north Missouri area. NOMO is compiling the information for the AUSA regarding a conspiracy case within our jurisdiction as a result of numerous interviews resulting from the pseudoephedrine pill logs. NOMO lost another Narcotics officer in April. NOMO was unable to replace that officer until July 1st. Unfortunately, bringing a two new officers up to speed requires a great deal of time and training. Both officers will be attending Narcotics School in August at MCTC in Fort Dodge, Iowa.

SEMO DTF

During May of 2016, the task force conducted its annually membership luncheon. Over 65 people attended including Chiefs, Sheriffs, state representatives etc. Representative Holly Rehder was our speaker and elaborated on the role of a prescription drug monitoring program for Missouri. On May 10, 2016 the task force office received heavy water damage and we have been forced to relocate. We are temporarily being housed in the Sikeston Department of Public Safety. We are currently in the process of locating a new office space.

ST CHARLES CO DTF

SCCRDTF is continuing to seeing a large influx of ICE and Heroin into our area. We have also begun to see large shipments of marijuana from Colorado, California and Oregon. We have continued to aggressively pursue street level and mid-level drug traffickers in an effort to combat a rising problem. Once again JAG funding has been reduced and this impacts our ability to aggressively pursue drug traffickers in respect to operational funding. These types of investigations are labor intensive and require the involvement of all of the SCCRDTF's resources. As a result of long hours and no funding for manpower, due to reduced operational funds, we are forced with SCCRDTF resources having to take leave. Often this leave has a negative impact on the work product and our ability to pursue investigations. Increased funding would greatly aid in our efforts to remove dangerous narcotics from our community.

SCCRDTF Detective/TFO Juan Wilson is continuing to multiple presentations to businesses, civic organizations and schools as part of our partnership with CRUSH and DEA. We are actively participating in the DEA 360 program.

ST LOUIS CO MJDTF

Last period we started the Narcan training in St. Louis County. Since the inception we have used Narcan 17 times with 16 successful outcomes. We are expanding the program and teaching other agencies in our area.
