The task force also collects and destroyed prescription drugs for our citizenry on our own as well. We also have an investigator that participates in the local drug free kids coalition and is an active board member.

The drop box is located at the Montgomery City Police Department, in Montgomery County, Missouri. Due to Montgomery City being centrally located in our Task Force coverage area, the drop box was chosen to be placed there. This offers a unique opportunity for our Task Force to allow citizens to conveniently dispose and remove old prescription medication. The permanent drug drop box is intended for community collaboration with law enforcement and provides a permanent and continuous availability to keep unneeded and expired medications out of the hands of Missouri's youth and citizens. Task Force Officers work regularly, on a monthly basis with the Montgomery City Police Department to count and weigh the drop box's content and coordinate/handle the destruction/disposal of all medication. Approximately sixty (60) pounds of Prescription Drugs were recovered from the drop box during the quarter (not recorded on Page 4 or 5 of this document).
FRANKLIN CO NARC	Yes We have several drug take back boxes located throughout the County. These are emptied on a regular basis and the drugs are disposed of properly.
JACKSON CO MJDTF	Yes JCDF participated in the COMBAT prescription drug take back and neighborhood cleanup on July 29, August 26 and September 30, 2016. The OIC was part of a panel of experts in a Town Hall meeting as part of the American Addiction Centers addressing the emerging Heroin epidemic The OIC attended the COMBAT conference on secondary trauma. The OIC attended the Law Enforcement Treatment Exchange with other COMBAT treatment agencies.

The members of the Gathering Table are an organization who helps drug users and their families to stop using drugs. Their concern was law enforcement was not attempting to combat the community drug problem. The task Force explained we have joined forces with the Carrollton Police department and the drug problem is being addressed on a daily basis. The confusion with most of the public was drug investigations are not publicized or talk about openly within the law enforcement world. Another aspect of the investigations is, law enforcement has legal boundaries to comply with. After explaining to the Gathering Table how investigations work they realized that just because someone files a complaint about drugs does not automatically give law enforcement the probable cause to knock the door down and arrest the offenders. The meeting was very informative and they understood more what law enforcement must do in these investigations.
LANEG	Yes A LANEG task force officer is assigned to attend and participate in the Osage County Anti-Drug Committee with representatives from each law enforcement agency, school system, EMS and church pastors in Osage County. The intentions of the committee is to develop avenues to deal with the current drug problem in the county. The committee understands law enforcement action is not the only solution to the current drug problem. The committee is pushing for more community involvement and local resources to widen the approach to deal with and lessen the impacts of illegal drug use and abuse.

CNET	Yes CNET participates in Drug Court panels in all of our counties. CNET advises other board members of current participants and advises the board on future candidates histories and current situations.
COMET	Yes Our officers are involved with several drug court programs in Christian County, Greene County, Stone County, Taney County, and Webster County by conducting investigations in relation to drug court participants who are suspected of not following their guidelines. COMET officers also send some deferred cases to drug court treatment programs for early intervention. COMET also investigates participants of drug addiction treatment centers who are suspected of abusing or mishandling those programs, preventing them from breaking the cycle of drugs and violence.
EAST CENTRAL DTF	Yes Our Task Force Officers are required to actively assist, attend meetings for Drug Court. When our officers attend Drug Court meetings, our officers can provide input regarding the treatment and the rehabilitation for the offenders participating with drug court. Also, our Task Force Officers are frequently engaging and assisting informants and providing rehabilitation outlets, so they can receive treatment for any drug addictions or abuse. Task Force Officers have routinely referred individuals through enforcement contact rehabilitation facilities, such as the Hannibal Council on Alcohol and Drug Abuse and the Audrain County Narcotics Anonymous.
FRANKLIN CO NARC	Yes We have Officers assigned to three drugs courts in the Task Force Area. These officers assist in coordinating with Foundations for Franklin County (FFC), a 501(c)3, to provide funding and assistance to drug court clients and their children. Additionally, all task force officers assist in coordinating with FFC to provide funding and assistance to at-risk children in the foster care system. This coordination is very helpful when parents who are suffering from addiction are working toward reunification with their children. Properly assisting these families through their struggles with addiction helps provide accountability and aids in increasing their ability to stay on the path of recovery. Task force officers provide first-hand knowledge that allows FFC to ensure the needs of these families are met appropriately, and they also provide insight in understanding the needs of our community and how to address the challenges we face regarding addiction and recovery. Examples include funding for activities that enhance a child's self-esteem (sports, music lessons, swim lessons, educational activities, etc.) and emergency needs (grocery vouchers, utilities, clothing, etc.). Additional assistance consists of coordination/referrals to other service providers in our area to address further needs (counseling, job training/placement, etc.) to help keep families intact.

The P/P officer will monitor the reintegration process by verifying an individuals reported residence, employment status and rehabilitation program attendance. The benefit to home visits outside of an individuals monthly reporting to a P/P office, is the ability for the P/P officer to identify individuals who may be at risk for drug relapse or in need of more rehabilitative treatment and or more intensive supervision contacts. These interactions between the agencies create lines of communication that foster positive work relations and combined efforts.

MINERAL AREA DTF	Yes During the reporting period, the Mineral Area Drug Task Force had an officer assigned to the St. Francois County Drug Court Board. This officer also delivers input to the board on options for the participants, varying from congratulatory to sanctions.
