We do not have the manpower to keep up with the need this community /area has. We can only look deeply into about 50% of all crime stoppers. We just don't have the means to keep up with the enormous demand.</p>
COMET	<p>COMET has gone through a few personnel changes recently. As of September, we had only 4 officers serving 9 counties. COMET is also starting to initiate long term investigations, to make a greater impact on our service area.</p>

The recent reduction of manpower leaves a strain on man-power, the remaining officers to cover the remaining six county service/coverage area. Team and the Missouri Division of Family Services responded to the motel to execute the search warrant and conduct an inspection of the premises for various health and codes violations. Subsequently, numerous rooms were checked with an additional search warrant obtained for room #27. 25 subjects were contacted and 17 were arrested on 40 various charges. 3 felony drug arrests 1 felon in possession of a firearm 3 felony stop orders 19 General ordinance summons 13 arrest warrants. Additionally, the JCDF obtained a search warrant for a residence believed to be a `stash House` for a known drug dealer in Jackson County. In a subsequent search of the residence Detectives recovered almost 5 pounds of methamphetamine and a bundle of US currency which included JCDF money used in the previous transaction. Investigation continues.

JASPER CO DTF

The Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team had a great 3 Quarter for 2015. ODET Detectives seized 9,336.4 grams of Meth this quarter and 14,728.6 grams of High Grade Marijuana along with 18.7 grams of Heroin. ODET Detectives also seized 31 handguns this quarter and initiated 69 investigations and served 20 Search Warrants. On 08/05/2015 ODET Detectives arrested Jeronimo Juarez at 2106 Tyler in Joplin. Juarez was in possession of 5.7 Lbs of meth and 4 firearms. On 08/11/15 ODET Detectives arrested Santiago Soto at 1014 Roosevelt in Joplin. Soto was in possession of 5 lbs of meth and 6 guns. On 08/12/15 ODET Detectives arrested Jonathon Ayuar and Eder Gonzales at the Best western Motel in Joplin. Ayuar and Gonzales were in possession of 1lb of meth. On 08/20/15 ODET Detectives arrested Luis Rodriguez in Carthage Missouri for possession of over 2 ounces of meth. On 08/21/15 ODET Detectives located over 2 lbs of meth in a storage shed unit in Joplin. The meth was hidden inside sealed cans of vegetables. This seizure led to the arrest of Jasmine Bereki and Jason Olsson both out of California. On 09/22/15 ODET Detectives arrested Paul Getty and Nicola McElroy both from Springfield. They were located at the motel district in Joplin and were in possession of 79 grams of meth. ODET Detectives continue to see a rise in ICE coming to this area but continue to work large scale investigations which have led to several indictments with more pending. Several DTO?s have been identified and we have continued with aggressive enforcement actions against them.

KANSAS CITY MJDTF

MoWin is currently involved in multiple different types of investigations. In Clay County 13 individuals were arrested in a long term meth and heroin investigation that continues. Heroin continues to be on the rise. The task force is currently over 80 lbs year to date in heroin recoveries. The K-9 officers on the task force have conducted four drug sweeps of schools during the quarter. They have also done two demonstrations for schools regarding narcotics and K-9 work. We continue to participate in drug court and have detectives teaching classes at the high school Career Center Located in Platte Co for all high school students. PCMEG-TFO J.A. has attended narcotics supervisor training.

LAFAYETTE CO NARC

During the first Quarter of the 2015-2016 grant year, the Lafayette County Drug Task Force struggled with maintaining a balance between drug interdiction investigations and local drug investigations. Once the grant was approved in mid-September we immediately had a first drug Task Force Board meeting. The grant approved another investigator/agent assigned to the task force, which was a detective from the Johnson County Sheriff's Department and start date was September 26th. Warrensburg Police Department advised they were assigning their full time narcotics detective to work with the Lafayette County Drug Task Force also. I advised the Drug Task Force Board members, I would be re-writing Johnson County and Warrensburg MOU agreements with the Lafayette County Drug Task Force to reflect their new involvement and participation in the program. Further discussion included all board members agreed their local School Resource Officers could be involved with the program. Most all agencies supplied me with all School Resource Officers contact information and further agreed for them to assist the Drug Task Force in coordinating drug education, prevention and rehabilitation presentations in the Task Force Service areas. Hopefully, the Lafayette County Drug Task Force will find the balance needed to not only provide adequate drug investigations in our service area but also meet our grant goals and objectives for the remaining grant year.

LANEG

LANEG gave a 30 minute presentation to approximately 100 individuals at the Tri County Health Fair in Richland. The purpose of this presentation was to inform the public of current drug abuse trends in their community. The lecture included signs and symptoms of common drugs of abuse and means available to report individuals using illegal drugs, or individuals who may be potentially at risk to their proximity to illegal drugs. LANEG continues to focus its major efforts on combating the illegal drug trade in the five county task force area. The task force has scheduled and will continue to provide training to local agencies, schools and community groups about local drug trends and the impact of drugs on the community. Marijuana, illegal sales of prescription medication, and heroin sales remain present in certain areas of the task force but have not appeared to increase. The task force had a decrease in total number of abandoned meth laboratories seized during this quarterly reporting period. This decrease may be due to the proactive enforcement of assigned and trained task force officer's in their assigned area of responsibility. Hydroponic marijuana and methamphetamine sales and availability have appeared to increase in the task force area. LANEG officers continue to see a decrease in the sale of synthetic marijuana and bath salts by local distributors in the task force area. Confidential sources have informed our officers, individuals purchasing synthetic drugs are having to travel outside of the LANEG task force area. This decrease may be a direct result from aggressive investigations and local distributors being informed of the illegal nature and laws concerning the sales of synthetic drugs. LANEG is currently participating in follow up investigations and several ongoing federal and state investigations involving the

LANEG officers have initiated and are currently involved in undercover investigations focusing on known drug distributors in the task force area. LANEG is currently working with and de-conflicting drug investigations with other task forces in the Troop F, D and I areas.
MID-MO MJDTF	Attended briefing on drug rehabilitation awareness and funding, conducted by U.S. Representatives Vicky Hartzler.
MINERAL AREA DTF	During the reporting period the Mineral Area Drug Task Force initiated a federal distribution case involving methamphetamine through the United States Postal Service. Two ounces of methamphetamine was seized and an additional two ounces were delivered to the suspect to further the investigation. This is an ongoing investigation.
MUSTANG	The MUSTANG Drug Task Force applied and executed 16 search warrants in Callaway and Cole Counties. Search warrants and interdiction methods resulted in the seizure of \$19,578 in US currency and 22 firearms. Some of the firearms were recovered from a burglary which resulted in 1 arrest and other stolen goods recovered.
NEMO TF	One arrest was made for 2nd degree domestic assault. Of the 16 Search Warrants applied for and executed, 8 were for cellular phones therefore did not result in arrests or seizures. In addition to the 24 cultivated marijuana plants, we also located and destroyed 106 wild marijuana plants.
NITRO	In August 2015, NITRO officers Coon, McAllister and Adams attended a 36 hour advanced Covert Ops Training put on by the International Association of Undercover Officers. On August 17, 2015, Coon and McAllister conducted a class on drug identification, drug investigations for the Citizen Academy being conducted by the Trenton Police Department. In the previous quarter NITRO was involved in the purchase and seizure of approximately 75 pounds of methamphetamine. During that investigation a tracker was placed on a tractor trailer rig. In July 2015, with the assistance of the tracker the tractor trailer was stopped by DEA in the state of Texas and 88 pounds of methamphetamine was seized with three arrests. On September 10, 2015, Coon attended a task force regional meeting held in Kirksville, Missouri. Present was representatives from the NOMO, NEMO and Buchanan County Drug Strike Force. 54 firearms were seized or purchased during the quarter. 38 of the firearms were recovered during a search warrant. The remaining firearms were purchased, most during the purchase of controlled substances. NITRO applied for one search warrant but served a total of 4 search warrants. Three of the search warrants were applied for by other agencies but served by NITRO. Coon continues to assist Grundy County with a burglary of a business where approximately \$150,000.00 in cash, gold and silver was stolen. NITRO made 8 controlled purchases of controlled substance. NITRO purchased 25.1 gr of crack cocaine, 561 grams of methamphetamine and 30 dilaudid.

NOMO DTF	<p>OIC Meeting was attended by Capt. Chris Brown on October 15th, 2015 at the Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri. NOMO DTF hosted a Regional Task Force meeting in Kirksville on September 10th, 2015. The following agencies attended: NOMODTF, NITRO, Buchanan County Drug Strike Force and NEMO DTF. NOMO has an ongoing investigation with the ATF and Lee County Iowa Drug Task Force dealing with the transportation of drugs and weapons across state lines. NOMO is working an investigation with the USPS regarding legal marijuana from Colorado and California being shipped via Postal Service into the NOMO Task Force area. NOMO is also working a case of illegal synthetic marijuana being brought into our coverage area via USPS. NOMO DTF participated in a joint investigation with the Northeast Missouri Drug Task Force, City of Macon Police Department and City of Shelbina Police Department and was able to apprehend individuals from the State of Florida who were buying prescription drugs (Oxy) with fraudulent prescriptions.</p>
SEMO DTF	<p>In addition to the prescription drug take back and red ribbon week activities, officers conducted a warrant roundup in Butler County in September. 24 suspects were arrested in a one day operation which stemmed from a two year long investigation.</p>
ST CHARLES CO DTF	<p>SCCRDTF is seeing an influx of 'ICE' and Heroin into our area. We are aggressively pursuing street level and mid-level drug traffickers in an effort to combat a rising problem. Once again JAG funding has been reduced and this impacts our ability to aggressively pursue drug traffickers in respect to operational funding. These types of investigations are labor intensive and require the involvement of all of the SCCRDTF's resources. As a result of long hours and no funding for manpower, due to reduced operational funds, we are forced with SCCRDTF resources having to take leave. Often this leave has a negative impact on the work product and our ability to pursue investigations.</p>
ST LOUIS CO MJDTF	<p>The St. Louis County Police Multi-Jurisdictional Task Force recently instituted a new program called Mission Save, which includes the FBI, St. Louis city, ATF, DEA and St. Louis County, which identifies the most dangerous gangs with a drug and gun nexus in the St. Louis area and build cases on these gangs and individuals. The newly formed task force reaped success with the execution of two search warrants resulting in the arrest of the target of this investigation, which covered multi-states, and involved the manufacturing/trafficking of marijuana, powder cocaine and MDMA. \$420,000.00, 15 assorted assault rifles and 30 handguns were seized. Also located was a Gang Unit uniform polo style shirt from the Arlington Texas Police Department and body armor.</p>
