With the decrease in the street value of methamphetamine in the last three years, \$1200.00 an ounce in 2014 and \$800.00 an ounce today. We have had a hard time keeping up with the supply. We have new multiple ounce dealers weekly. With as small as our unit is we have to prioritize which dealers we go after; thus not getting to all or even most of them. Our other issue is that heroin is beginning to creep into our community. We have had heroin buys in 2015, but not many yet. But many confidential informants are beginning to talk about other people using and selling heroin. Heroin, prescription pills and methamphetamine will likely be our three most dangerous drugs in the task force service area for 2016.

COMET

Comet conducted a drug presentation to the following organizations: Springfield Rotary Club with 30 attending Child Services in Buffalo with 30 attending Greene Co Road Crews in Springfield with 70 attending Marshfield School in Marshfield with 50 attending. COMET has eight officers serving 9 counties and has started to initiate long term investigations to make a greater impact on our service area. Our Task Force has continued to provide the services our member agencies have grown to appreciate and expect from our Task Force. Our Task Force Officers continue to conduct overt narcotic investigations in our six county coverage area. Our Task Force continues to assist with several Federal investigations, providing information and with active enforcement. Recently, our Task Force worked in cooperation with the Drug Enforcement Administration on a long and ongoing OCEDEFT investigation. As a result of the investigation with the Drug Enforcement Administration, large quantities of crystal methamphetamine has been seized. In addition, the investigation dismantled a number of local methamphetamine distributors, which will greatly affect the amount of methamphetamine that will reach the citizens of the Task Forces' coverage area. The Task Force also conducted six (6) drug educational presentations and taught over one hundred sixty nine (169) law enforcement and community members. The topics of the presentations ranged from drug identification to identity theft.

EAST CENTRAL DTF

FRANKLIN CO NARC

Heroin and fentanyl continue to be the cause of several drug overdoses in our area. We are working closely with the DEA in St. Louis to attempt to cut off or at least slow down the supply which comes from the City of St. Louis. We continue to see large amounts of ICE methamphetamine imported into the area from Mexico via Texas and Oklahoma. The number of methamphetamine labs located and destroyed in our area has leveled off after a dramatic decrease over the last year and a half.

JACKSON CO MJDTF

A JCDFTF undercover made several purchases of methamphetamine from a house in Kansas City, Missouri. During the investigation one source of supply was identified and subsequently followed to a residence in Kansas City, Kansas. On 12/16/2015, the DEA St. Louis Division was attempting to apprehend three fugitives in reference to a DEA investigation originating out of St. Louis at the Kansas residence identified in the JCDFTF investigation. During the DEA operation, one defendant was observed leaving the residence in Kansas. He was stopped at a local gas station and arrested without incident. The defendant was found to be in possession of approximately 1/2 pound of methamphetamine, \$5000 in cash and was armed with a Glock semi-auto pistol. He cooperated and provided information regarding the Kansas residence indicating it was a stash house and alleging 20 pounds of methamphetamine was inside the residence and it was occupied by armed individuals. Using information provided by the defendant and information provided by the JCDFTF a search warrant was obtained for the residence. Upon a search pursuant to the warrant Detectives recovered firearms including an AK-47 with four loaded 50-round magazines, a ballistic vest, a small amount of methamphetamine, a significant quantity of discarded packaging and currency. The investigations continues with DEA following up in Kansas and the JCDFTF undercover attempting to make purchases from the residence in Missouri in hopes of identifying a new source of supply.

JASPER CO DTF

ODET detectives seized 364 grams of meth this quarter and 48,579 grams of high grade marijuana (107 LBS). ODET detectives also seized 15 guns this quarter and initiated 46 investigations and served 12 search warrants. On 10/01/15 ODET detectives conducted a knock and talk at 1402 Ellis in Webb City Missouri which led to the arrest of Dylan Burks. Detectives seized cocaine and 86 grams of THC wax from the residence along with \$14,768 in US currency. On 10/28/15 ODET detectives conducted a buy bust operation in Carthage Missouri which led to the arrest of Elvis Rodus. Rodus was in possession of over 3 ounces of methamphetamine. On 11/17/15 ODET detectives along with Joplin Patrol officers arrested a suspect from Springfield Missouri on multiple felony warrants and located over 2 ounces of meth in his vehicle along with a loaded handgun. On 11/19/15 ODET detectives conducted a controlled delivery to 115 Justin Street in Webb City Missouri. Detectives arrested Mike Saqqa who was in possession of cocaine and approximately 10 lbs of high grade marijuana. On 11/24/15 ODET detectives served a warrant on an apartment belonging to Cory Black in Joplin. Black is a known Joplin Honky and was in possession of 2 ounces of meth. On 12/02/15 ODET detectives served a search warrant at 601 w 33 in Joplin that led to the arrest of Richard Chaplin who was in possession of 64 lbs of high grade marijuana. ODET detectives continue to see a rise in ICE coming to this area but continue to work large scale investigations which have led to several indictments with more pending. Several DTO's have been identified and we have continued with aggressive enforcement actions against them.

JEFFERSON CO MEG

During the reporting period, the JCMEG also had 6 child endangerment arrests and 1 weapon violation arrest. These arrests occurred during a drug related incident and/or other drug arrests.

KANSAS CITY MJDTF

MoWin task force has seen a large increase in the trafficking of Meth during this quarter. The task force recovered 111 lbs of meth during the third quarter alone. A large conversion lab was also discovered and one of the first to be discovered in the Midwest. Presentations were conducted with north Haven Neighborhood Group on November 19. The presentation included a K-9 demonstration and drug recognition class. There were 25 people present at the class. K-9 conducted sweeps of three high schools and also taught two high school classes to criminal justice classes. Drug Take Back program was completed on September 26th. It was not reported on the last quarter because the final information was not available at that time. Sgt. J.A. attended narcotics supervisor training in Texas. All Clay County detectives attended the Reid Interview and Interrogation School on 11-2 through 11-4.

LAFAYETTE CO NARC

During the second Quarter of the 2015-2016 grant year, the Lafayette County Drug Task Force was able to maintaining a better balance between drug interdiction investigations and local drug investigations. Johnson County Narcotics Detective Aaron Brown and Warrensburg Narcotics Detective Trent Froebe both came on board and began making cases. The Lafayette County Drug Task Force reported 30 new cases in the first quarter, which has doubled in the second totaling 61. This increase in cases affected everything across the board including drug seizures and arrests. The Lafayette County Drug Task force worked hard to continue meeting the programs goals and objectives. The Task Force organized and presented two drug awareness programs to two schools this quarter, which required a lot of time and effort. The task force was able to attend one department meeting where training was supplied in reference to cultivating informants and informant management. The task force plans to attend at least two other schools this quarter plus cultivate two other civic groups to speak with. The task force is currently trying to plan the next drug task force board meeting and communicating with other local drug task force to schedule another regional meeting. Our prosecuting attorney's office and judges are somewhat skeptical and resistant of drug task force personnel being involved with our court STOP program rehabilitation program. The reasoning is because they believe the clients would be intimidated by law enforcement presence and not honest with the case workers/probation parole/prosecutors and/or judge. It was also pointed out, clients in the program are not convicted and still are represented by a defense attorney, which they believe will create problems especially if the client fails out of the program. This is like a deferred prosecution in which, if the client completes the program, the felony goes away. The drug task force also reached out to an outpatient group called Pathways who are a mental health and drug addiction service. They also declined to let law enforcement attend or assist in rehabilitation or attend their monthly meetings with patients with addiction. However, Probation and parole did

agreed to supply court 'STOP' program clients who were willing to assist the drug task force with public speaking about drug use and addiction. This was voluntary for the STOP clients, but is rewarded by credited community service hours. In an attempt to comply with the JAG grant goals and objectives in reference to the task force's involvement with drug prevention and drug rehabilitation, the Lafayette County DTF designed a program we believed meet the criteria of our involvement. The drug task force implemented and coordinated a school presentation, which involved law enforcement and the court 'STOP' program clients speaking to junior high and high school students. This quarter, the task force along with 4 to 6 program clients went to the Lexington and Odessa high schools and spoke to about 450 students, grades 9 thru 12. The STOP program clients would individually tell their story of drug use, arrest(s), court, family issues, consequences for their actions, what they lost and what they plan on recovering in their life. During each program, the audience and teachers can ask questions, which are addressed by the client or law enforcement. After conducting several of these presentations last year and this year we asked students and teachers how they thought this program was working. Most all the students stated this is a more effective way to inform students of the dangers and consequences of drug use. Most admitted they paid attention and some related to the speakers throughout the entire program. Our local judge, prosecutor, teachers and the court 'Stop' program officials all agree this awareness program may and/or will prevent some students from trying drugs. According to probation and parole along with the court 'STOP' program officials and judge, they believe this part of the program has been very beneficial to the 'STOP' clients continued sobriety throughout the program and success after the program. The court STOP program clients also acknowledged, speaking with the students was good therapy and gave them a sense of worth knowing they may be helping a student from making the mistakes and choices they did is.

LANEG

LANEG gave a two and one-half presentation to approximately 25 individuals at the Osage County Anti-Drug Coalition in Linn. The purpose of this presentation was to inform the attendees of current drug abuse trends in their community. The lecture included signs and symptoms of common drugs of abuse and means available to report individuals using illegal drugs, or individuals who may be potentially at risk to their proximity to illegal drugs. LANEG has coordinated and worked with the Missouri State Probation and Parole in three counties within the task force area. This joint work approach has built up lines of communication between the agencies and has allowed for a better collection of intelligence, identification and intervention of illegal drug use in the task force area. These investigations target subjects at risk for substance abuse and/or sales who are currently assigned and supervised by the probation and parole within the task force area. This combined effort allows the agencies to identify subjects who may be better served by increased drug intervention programs or subjects who may need to

be prosecuted in local courts. LANEG continues to focus its major efforts on combating the illegal drug trade in the five county task force area. The task force has scheduled and will continue to provide training to local agencies, schools and community groups about local drug trends and the impact of drugs on the community. Marijuana, illegal sales of prescription medication, and heroin sales remain present in certain areas of the task force but have not appeared to increase. The task force had a decrease in total number of abandoned meth laboratories seized during this quarterly reporting period. This decrease may be due to the proactive enforcement of assigned and trained task force officers in their assigned area of responsibility. Hydroponic marijuana and methamphetamine 'ice' sales and availability have appeared to increase in the task force area. LANEG officers continue to see a decrease in the sale of synthetic marijuana and bath salts by local distributors in the task force area. Confidential sources have informed our officers, individuals purchasing synthetic drugs are having to travel outside of the LANEG task force area. This decrease may be a direct result from aggressive investigations and local distributors being informed of the illegal nature and laws concerning the sales of synthetic drugs. LANEG is currently participating in follow up investigations and several ongoing federal and state investigations involving the distribution of crystal methamphetamine, hydroponic marijuana and synthetic drugs. LANEG officers have initiated and are currently involved in undercover investigations focusing on known drug distributors in the task force area. LANEG is currently working with and de-conflicting drug investigations with other task forces in the Troop F, D and I areas.

MID-MO MJDTF

Twelve other arrests were made during this quarter. Seven warrant arrests, two felons in possession of firearm one stolen firearm and two for providing precursors to manufacture.

MINERAL AREA DTF

Prison interdiction case, seized 23 grams of synthetic marijuana and charged 1-civilian and 2-offenders Seized 1 gram of synthetic marijuana from student at a High School in the task force coverage area.

MUSTANG

The MUSTANG Drug Task Force applied for 20 and executed 17 search warrants in Cole County, Callaway County, Audrain County and City of Boonville. They also assisted with search warrants in the City of Columbia and Boone County. Search warrants and interdiction methods resulted in the seizure of \$71,813 in US currency, 30 firearms, and 2 vehicles. They also recovered 1 vehicle that had been stolen. They also assisted with over 600 hours of surveillance for a DEA drug investigation.

NEMO TF

The Task Force was involved in a federal case with DEA and East Central Task Force which resulted in NEMO TF assisting with several search warrants in December.

NITRO

On October 15, 2015, Task Force Officer Greg Coon attended the OIC meeting at the Lake of the Ozarks. NITRO Task Force Officers McAllister and Adams attended the training provided by the MNOA on October 16, 2015. TFO's Coon, McAllister and Adams attended the lab re-certification training held in Macon Missouri on December 12, 2015 NITRO officers were involved in the execution of eight search warrants. Three of the warrants were involving drug investigations, four of the warrants were for phone information and one was involving a large burglary. During seven of the narcotic buys twenty firearms were also purchased, spending \$6,160.00 One of the search warrants mentioned was for cell phone information to locate a suspect involved in a kidnapping and sexual assault. Information received from the search warrant led to the arrest of the suspect by Task Force officers in the state of Kansas.

TFO Coon conducted a training at the Humphreys Missouri Elementary school for all students. Topics were school bullying and drugs. NITRO assisted Grundy County in a burglary investigation and a search warrant was obtained leading to the arrest of a suspect and the recovery of approximately \$14,000 worth of stolen silver. NITRO is assisting Grundy County Sheriff's Office and Trenton Police Department with controlled purchases of narcotics in Trenton, Missouri.

NOMO DTF

OIC Meeting was attended by Capt. Chris Brown on October 15th, 2015 at the Lake of the Ozarks, Missouri. NOMO has an ongoing investigation with the Vermillion County Iowa Drug Task Force dealing with the transportation of drugs and weapons across state lines. NOMO along with the Missouri State Highway Patrol Rural Crimes Division and the Chariton County Sheriff's Department are working a multi- jurisdictional investigation into stolen property and illegal drug activity covering several counties in our area. NOMO DTF is continuing a joint investigation with the Northeast Missouri Drug Task Force, City of Macon Police Department and City of Shelbina Police Department regarding numerous individuals obtaining fraudulent prescriptions.

SEMO DTF

During December of 2015, the task force Board of Directors hosted 4 state representatives and 1 state senator at our December Board meeting. We discussed issues related to state government and drug enforcement. These included the prescription drug monitoring program and funding issues.

ST CHARLES CO DTF

SCCRDTF is continuing to seeing a large influx of 'ICE' and Heroin into our area. We are aggressively pursuing street level and mid-level drug traffickers in an effort to combat a rising problem. Once again JAG funding has been reduced and this impacts our ability to aggressively pursue drug traffickers in respect to operational funding. These types of investigations are labor intensive and require the involvement of all of the SCCRDTF's resources. As a result of long hours and no funding for manpower, due to reduced operational funds, we are forced with SCCRDTF resources having to take leave. Often this leave has a negative impact on the work product and our ability to pursue investigations. Increased funding would greatly aid in our efforts to remove dangerous narcotics from our community.

ST LOUIS CO MJDTF

We continue to provide education, research and information to area schools, hospitals, church groups and area leaders in reference to heroin prevention. These efforts have helped contribute to a 23% drop in heroin overdose deaths in St. Louis County.
