 - i. Conducted a needs assessment of HT training needs for individuals working in the field within the state of Missouri
 - ii. The objective was to learn about the education and training needs of human trafficking service providers
 - iii. Methods
 - 1. 6 focus group sessions
 - 2. Key informant interviews (case study reviews)
 - 3. Statewide data
 - iv. Recommendations and Findings
 - 1. Allocate resources to ensure professionals have ongoing access to foundational human trafficking training
 - 2. Identify or develop training on specialized topics, victim psychology, and trauma-informed response
 - 3. Explore venues and programming for prevention with young people
 - 4. Develop collaborative response and centralized systems for information sharing
 - v. Challenges
 - 1. Data collection
 - a. Data exists among several different state departments and there is not a single source identified for data (word for pool of data)
 - i. Council recommendation to utilize newly funded DSS FTE position(s) to reconvene council data collection sub-committee to address information and data sharing among stakeholders statewide
 - 2. Training and education for medical providers
 - 3. Providing awareness and prevention education within school settings
 - c. Study underway to identify gaps and needs for professionals within the school setting to recognize indicators of HT among students
