**Subject:** HB 1456 opt-out action deadline – November 16, 2018

---

Section 190.460, RSMo, creates a new prepaid wireless emergency telephone service charge. Amounts collected from this charge will be remitted to your county in direct proportion to the amount of charges collected. § 190.460.3(5), RSMo. This service charge goes into effect automatically January 1, 2019 unless your jurisdiction takes affirmative action.

**To opt in to the charge:** No action is needed.

**To opt out of the charge:** A city or county must pass an ordinance, order, rule, or resolution by no less than two-thirds of the governing body 45 days prior to January 1, 2019. § 190.460.7, RSMo.

The provisions of HB 1456 apply differently to different counties and cities. Counties/cities should consult with their respective legal counsel regarding specific questions about the interpretation or applicability of this bill as it relates to the specific circumstances of the county or city.
