What is the difference between a Sheriff Deputy and a Police Officer?

There are two municipalities within Linn County. Police Officers primarily serve the citizens of those incorporated cities, and the Sheriff's Deputies perform the same duties as Police Officers within all of Linn County. Although Sheriff's Deputies primarily serve the citizens of unincorporated Linn County, the authority of the Sheriff and his Deputies to enforce state laws, including state traffic laws, extend across the entire county.
